

Take-Home-Exam: PHF-engl-E-Lit-45-E, Literature and Media

Questions:

1. Define representation and show the range of meanings this term can have. Why is it interesting to look at “Representations of Elizabeth I”? Think of the different aspects of the term representation and how they can be applied to the creation of the images of Elizabeth. Think of self-representation and the images constructed in different media through the centuries. Please use the texts we read in class as a starting point. (ca. 3 pages)
2. Choose two of the films we studied in this class and compare the images of Elizabeth constructed in them. What do they have in common, what are their differences? Can you find reasons (e.g. the different genres, the different times in which they were made etc.) for these parallels and differences? (The films can be borrowed from Prof. Horatschek’s Hiwis in room 212). (ca. 4 pages)

- Please **do not** hand in your take-home-exam in a folder! Just clip or staple it together.
