Topic Analyze Woolf’s *Kew Gardens* as an example of a modernist text (3 pages, this does not include the title page, table of content and bibliography).

How to structure the paper:

1. Give your paper a title, i.e. reformulate the topic accordingly.
2. Structure your paper in introduction, main part and conclusion (+ title page, table of content, footnotes, bibliography). **Do not** begin new pages for new chapters (you should do so, however, in the longer term papers you are going to write in the following semesters).
3. Use the set of conventions outlined in “How to write a seminar paper”: (Can be found in the reader or at: <http://www.anglistik.uni-kiel.de/index.php/downloads-43.html>). This style sheet does not only contain information on footnotes but also on the structure of seminar papers. Please read it carefully and take special note of the instructions on what you should **not** do in a seminar paper.

Your paper should include the following elements:

1. a brief definition of modernism, especially its formal features (use the material from the reader).
2. an analysis in which those features are applied to the text. Definition and analysis should interact, i.e. the definition should contain mainly elements and concepts which you are going to use in your analysis.
3. Consider the differences to realist texts. Which is the aim of this new form of representing reality?
4. As a comprehensive treatment of the topic is not possible (and therefore not expected!) on three pages, focus on some central elements!

Additional tasks for those who did not go to the „Seminarbibliothek“ (one mark will be deduced from your mark for the paper, if you do not complete the following tasks). If you are in doubt whether this concerns you, please contact me by e-mail.
